General Arts and Science-Workplace (GASW)		This two-semester program offers math, science, business, and communications enrichment, as well as various vocational elective courses. It allows students to broaden their knowledge while developing different career-specific skills in topics ranging from Carpentry and Renovation and Mechanical Techniques to Journalism and Esthetics and Spa Management. Graduates have the option of continuing their studies in a diploma or advanced diploma program, or entering the workforce directly with this post-secondary credential. INSPIRE	Age 15-30 to meet basic eligibility	The INSPIRE program at Prince Edward Learning Centre in Picton is a youth employment and education program that focuses on assisting youth to find meaningful work in their community. Our 22 week program connects youth facing barriers to employment with employers in Prince Edward County. Youth participants begin with 2 weeks of in class pre-employment training followed by a 20 week job placement. Youth participants are paid \$14/hour for up to 37.5 hours per week.
