Exploring home-sharing for seniors

What is home-sharing?

Home-sharing involves a homeowner offering affordable accommodations in exchange for payment and (optionally) household support.

Shared housing can benefit seniors by enabling them to age in place.





33.5% of the PEC population is age 65+

of PEC households have a single occupant (3,005 people)

How would it work?



 The PEC Home-sharing model
 would seek to connect home providers with home seekers.

Why home-sharing in PEC?

- 27% of households are occupied by only one person; many are seniors.
- A critical housing shortage hinders our community's capacity to attract and retain workers in various sectors ie. healthcare.
- New construction will not be able to keep pace with demand.
- Our community has a significantly older population.
- Single seniors are susceptible to social isolation and low-income.
